The Kingdom of God is a kingdom of words. Words are creative. They have power. The clearest example of this is the opening of Genesis, in which God speaks the universe into being.

Humans are made in God's likeness. Like God, we have the power of speech. The implication is that our words, too, have creative power. This doctrine of words may seem new to some. To others, it will seem silly – even mere superstition – or the patterns can be explained by the principles of psychology alone. Others will affirm the spiritual power of words because of your own life experiences. The basis for such an assertion is rooted firmly in Catholic theology, more specifically Sacramental Theology, whose first principle is John 1:14: "*And the Word became flesh*." Words "become flesh," that is, they always and everywhere have a "sacramental" quality.

If the Kingdom of God is a kingdom of words, then we must take great care with the words we speak and hear. Words are never *not* sterile.

Our words can't create physical worlds as God's words can. But words create *spiritual realities*. Biblical characters who speak truth or who invoke words of praise on another create new spiritual realities which we commonly call *blessings*. Those who speak lies or who proclaim evil over another create negative spiritual realities called *curses*. Almost everything we say can be placed in these two categories.

Words can be a powerful spiritual force, therefore, to build someone up or to tear someone down. When we speak to others (or about others when they are not present), our words either bless or curse. Even words of just criticism or words of warning need to be framed within the context of words which bless.

Pastors have spiritual authority over their parishioners. Parents have a spiritual authority over their children. When parents speak to their children using words such as, "You're a good young man (or lady)!" or "You are a fun person to be with!" or "You are so strong and smart!" they speak words of blessing. The words act like seeds which, in time, can yield a harvest of the words spoken, such as goodness, fun, strength, intelligence, in the soul of the child.

"See how courageous Grandpa was in the war? He has always been a man of courage. And see how Grandma loves him and has become so successful and strong? – I know you will grow up to be just like them." These are powerful and positive words – beautiful words of blessing and encouragement. Moreover, words such as these not only bless, but they also create a spiritual connection between child and grandparent, summoning the gifts of the older generation to be spiritually downloaded to the new. These are the sorts of words that are among the most powerful a parent can speak to their children. It's also why grandparents are, in the words of a Chinese proverb, have double the influence of parents.

But what of words to a child that curse? Imagine a young child hearing words such as, "Look at you, you're such a mess! What will become of you?" or, "How could you be so stupid?" or, "Stop that, you are so annoying!" You can feel the negative power of these words of cursing just by reading them. These are words which might have the intention of parental correction, but in truth these words ring out with the power of a curse.

One of the most terrible curses uttered by a parent is to a child where there is divorce or dysfunction and abuse in a marriage. The mother may tell her son, "You're just like your father..." which could only mean that the son is going to be a failure as a husband, and that whatever negative or abusive traits the father has, she has assigned them to her son. If the father fails in his business, falls into alcoholism, or dies young, then the words of the mother portend what will happen to her son once he becomes an adult.

We must also consider that the words we speak are overheard by the inhabitants of the unseen world. The angels hear the positive words we speak, and they rejoice in them and magnify the blessing. They also hear curses we speak, and when they do, they must beseech God's throne for mercy and protection, all the while the demons who prowl about the face of the earth receive those negative words and their power, and armed with these verbal weapons, they whisper them into the mind of the child, and they plot that child's destruction.

If your memory is ever shaken (often out of the blue) by thoughts of evil words echoing from the past, either those hurtful words which you have received or those hateful words which you have uttered to others, you are assuredly in the vast majority. Haven't our parents in their attempts at discipline sometimes used harsh words in their correction, so that what was meant as a correction is received as a judgment?

But back to the problem at hand. What is there for us to do with those hurtful words that have festered within us? Here are a few signs that some oppressive word or curse has bound your soul and limited its freedom:

- 1. You feel your life is going nowhere, in circles, or in a downward spiral.
- 2. Nothing you do in life seems to work out.
- 3. You find yourself repeating the mistakes of a parent.
- 4. You always find yourself in bad relationships and bad friendships.
- 5. You confess the same serious sins, again and again.
- 6. You have an addiction.
- 7. You are unhappy.

Fortunately, just as curses are a spiritual reality, there exists a real spiritual remedy. We know from the Gospels that Jesus Christ has the power to set anyone free from any curse. He is called the "Word" for a reason: He has power over *all words*, including the negative ones which have "taken up residence," so to speak, in our souls.

"Taken up residence" – Are not curses much like squatters who have trespassed into our souls, taken up residence without invitation and refuse to leave? And when we try to evict them later in life, these squatters loudly assert themselves and claim rights over the soul's only rightful inhabitant – *you*. You may feel you can't evict such a word by your own power, which is why so many of us have felt so powerless, and we try to build a life tip-toeing around these plunderers of peace.

Yet also dwelling within our souls is a sleeping giant, the one who can deliver us, a permanent Divine Guest! With baptism, God Himself has taken up residence in our souls! So why hasn't this Divine Guest protected me and come to my assistance? Perhaps you have ignored the Divine Indwelling of God. More likely, you simply haven't requested your Divine Guest to evict the harmful intruder! Yes, we have to ask for such favors from God who, although he knows what we need before we ask, wants us to ask for his assistance with a believing faith: "Ask and you shall receive, seek and you shall find, knock, and it shall be opened unto you" (Matthew 7:7); and, "According to your faith let it be done to you" (Matthew 9:29).

Your Divine Guest, the Holy Trinity, is a jealous lover of your soul. He desires the dwell in *every room* of your soul's mansion. The Second Person of the Holy Trinity especially, Jesus, the Word of God, will be delighted to evict any and every evil word which may be occupying the rooms, closets, and crawlspaces of your soul: *Yet you must ask!*

"Lord, I am not worthy, ... yet only say the word, and my soul shall be healed" (Matthew 8, 8). Only say the word – The Roman Centurion had so much believing faith he *knew* that Jesus didn't even have to enter his home. Merely asking Jesus, with faith, is all that is needed for healing.

The remedy to procure our liberation is a procedure so simple it might even seem a challenge to our faith to really and truly believe that Jesus can set us free. Maybe therein lies the challenge: Do I have a believing faith in the power of Jesus, the Word? Yet we are told in Scripture that we have this power. The power of Christ within us is real.

Ask Jesus to set you free, and you will be set free. But use the right words! To evict the evil caused by hurtful words, we must use our words with precision! In fact, the more accurate and detailed you are about the words and the affliction these words have caused, the greater the efficacy of the spiritual healing. The more accurately a problem or word can be named, and the more specific its origin (i.e. the one who spoke the negative words), the more effective. Let us recall the beginning of this reflection: the Kingdom of God is a Kingdom of Words. Therefore, choose your words!

Using the following prayer formula, prayer for enlightenment, pray for God's guidance, and then compose the specific prayer that you need for deliverance from all curses. Pray it again and again, until Jesus has set you free.

> In the name of Jesus, I sever and break any and all curses (state the words which have hurt you if possible) placed upon me by (state the person's name) and I ask the Lord to replace these curses with their corresponding and opposite blessings (state the blessings). Amen.
