I wish you all a Holy and Happy Thanksgiving. These two pastels which I include here, one of St. John the Evange-

list and of the Blessed Virgin Mary,

belonged to our first and greatest President, George Washington.

It may seem a bit peculiar that a Protestant President (as most Virginians, Washington was an Anglican) would own such images, since despite the High Anglican tradition of honoring the saints and the Blessed Virgin Mary, it would have been regarded as too "papist' for an Anglican to own such images, let alone place them prominently in his parlor.

But a little known fact is that all through his life our first president had a very high regard for the Catholic Faith. Apparently, Washington had gained a tremendous respect for the Catholic Faith during his lifetime, attending Catholic Mass on occasion, such as at Old St. Mary's in Philadelphia. Washington donated a considerable sum for the building of St. Augustine Catholic Church in Philadelphia the construction of which was begin three years prior to Washington's death. As a general, he was supposedly known to scold his troops for using the Lord's Name in vain, reminding them that God would not afford them a victory, as long as they continued to dishonor the Lord.

There is even the pious tradition that at Valley Forge General Washington had a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary and received a vision about the destiny of the United States and of the great "Three Wars" of the Republic (The War of Independence, the Civil War, and a Great War which is still to come).

Of Washington's alleged vision at Valley Forge on Christmas Day, 1776, such is most likely apocryphal. Yet, there is no evidence to contradict it; and, fitting such a supernatural intervention, it was immediately following the purported vision that the course of the Revolutionary War experienced its own revolution: During which what historians call the "Ten Crucial Days," Washington's Army scored two staggering victories, first at Trenton on December 26 (The Continental Army lost only 5 men compared to 905 British and Hessian), then up the road at Princeton on January 3, 1776 (a battle which lasted only 20 minutes with American casualties 75, British 270).

Washington "the visionary" may be a contestable title. What is not incontestable is to grant Washington the title of "first Catholic president."

The long report among slaves of Mount Vernon as to Washington's deathbed conversion would be odd unless it were true. Though they recalled the President engaging in some practices of prayer that were regarded by them a somewhat papist, such as making the sign of the cross before meals, they were not prepared for what happened on his final day, which Washington's slaves recalled not out of fondness for what occurred, but due to their deepest sadness. Upon learning that their Washington had been snared by the "Scarlet Woman of Rome," whom they had been taught to hate, they shed tears of sadness at the loss of Washington's gentle soul!

Their account is as follows: On the day of Washington's death, Saturday December 14, 1799, Fr. Leonard Neale, S.J, who was a friend of the former President, was called to Mount Vernon from St. Mary's Mission across the Potomac River by one of Washington's slaves. As soon as Fr. Neale arrived, Washington made his Confession, was received into the Catholic Church, given Holy Communion, Last Rites, and the Apostolic Pardon.

I don't think it would be premature for each of us, when celebrating Thanksgiving with family and friends this year, to add a prayer of gratitude to God for granting to our nation such an outstanding Founding Father who may very well be also our Founding Saint.

Saint George Washington, pray for us.
